MINISTRY EXPERIENCE

1996-Present

Having started as a full-time volunteer, I have been part of the ongoing ministry in Whiteinch ever since. I have led various different types of small group – traditional Bible studies, 'cell' groups, social-based groups, and theological discussion groups. For 10 years I also led the sung worship on a Sunday morning, playing both guitar and bass guitar.

In 2011 I became an Elder, and took responsibility for the teaching programme, including the Sunday preaching rota, but also the matrix of other training and discipleship opportunities within the church, liaising with other ministries (such as youth and children's work). We have sought to create a more cohesive plan for ongoing discipleship whilst combating a trend toward Biblical illiteracy. Additionally, I was involved in preaching on a regular basis.

Forge Scotland (previously Invest)

2010-2014

Forge Scotland aims to "nurture and resource the missional church in Scotland". As part of the leadership team, I was involved in their year long 'Pioneer' course, which aims to train and mentor leaders who are thinking of developing new missional expressions.

My role involved delivery of content on the Forge weekends, planning and developing the syllabus, marking of essays, and mentoring students. Additionally, I frequently contributed written articles for the website.

VISION FOR MINISTRY

At the centre of my calling is a passionate belief in the importance of both making and maturing disciples, particularly through the preaching and application of Scripture. I believe that as we grow as disciples, we also become more able and more effective in our outreach to those who have yet to know Jesus.

Having spent significant time with pioneers, I am convinced of the need for strategic thinking, not just for pioneering work, but also for the more 'settled' work of parish ministry – although no church should ever think of itself as settled! I believe there is a vital place for the local church in seeing God's Kingdom come in Scotland, although it requires courage in the face of the (sometimes challenging) need for change.
